

Insurance for Professional Liability

We confirm that **The London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine (LSHTM)** is insured under a Clinical Trials insurance policy, no. F108161119, with Newline Group, underwriters at Lloyds, 8 Lloyds Avenue, London, EC3N 3EL.

Period of Insurance – 0001 hours from 1st June 2019 , subject to annual renewal.

Newline Group will indemnify the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine for their negligent acts errors or omissions as detailed in the insurance schedule of cover, and specifically 'Cardiac Safety clinical trial.

Trial Name: Aspirin and losartan in hospitalised COVID-19 patients: a multinational randomised open-label trial

Total no. of participants: 10,000 patients

Geographical area: worldwide including Nigeria, Malaysia, Pakistan, UK, but excluding the USA.

The policy covers the School's legal liability for third party death or bodily injury caused by any negligent act, error or omission during the conduct of the trial, including the legal liability of the sponsors of Cardiac Safety Trial and their agents who carry out the trial whilst acting for the LSHTM providing they act in accordance with LSHTM's instructions.

The policy extends to cover the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine as sponsor of the trial, for non-negligent compensation related to the conduct of the trial.

Limit of indemnity:

£10,000,000 any one claim and in the annual aggregate (total for both legal liability and non-negligent compensation)

We issue this certificate as evidence of insurance cover.

In every respect this certificate is subject to the policy terms, exceptions, conditions and limits.

Insurers will not make a payment under this policy into a country where to do so would breach local insurance regulation – in such circumstances the payment would be made to LSHTM in the UK and becomes LSHTM's responsibility for transferring the payment including any implications of so doing.
